The Greens Report

April brings the Masters Tournament to the Augusta National Golf Club and with it what most players consider to be the start of 2022's golf season!

A mild March set us up for great golf. The greens tolerated the winter well, and the Champion Bermuda greened up but didn't start growing until temperatures stabilized. Going into early spring, fertilizing to push growth can harm the greens. That's why we wait until we are confident the cold temperatures are behind us before applying fertilizer.

To start the season, we'll mow the rough at $\frac{3}{4}$ " and continue at this height for as long as we can. By starting this low, we should be able to keep the rough height under $\frac{1}{2}$ " this year, which will help avoid some of the issues we've dealt with in recent years.

Sponsored by the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA), Rounds 4 Research, generates funds used to ensure the future of golf.

Golf facilities all over the country (and a few outside of the US) donate rounds and "stay and play" packages, which are auctioned online. Local chapters receive monies to fund projects that will have the most significant impact in their areas.

The auction takes place from April 25 to May 1, so please consider bidding.






