DRESS CODE

General Dress Code: The Orangeburg Country Club expects both men and women to dress in proper golf attire. Men and boys (beginning at age 10) must wear shirts with collars – no tee shirts. Golf shorts (just above the knee) are permitted for men and women. Short shorts, jogging shorts, bike shorts, athletic shorts, coaching shorts, cut off jeans, tank top shirts, halter tops, and swim suits are not permitted in the Clubhouse, on the golf course, or elsewhere on the Club premises. Blue jeans with no visible rips are allowed in the dining room. Exceptions are the appropriate attire for swimming and tennis complexes; however, such attire is restricted to those areas.

Blackwater Grille: General dress code applies. Caps and hats are prohibited for gentlemen.

Clubhouse Bar: Golf and tennis attire are permitted in the Bar. Swimming attire is not allowed in the Bar.

Tennis Attire: Accepted tennis clothing and shoes are required. Prohibited clothing includes shoes not made specifically for wear on tennis courts, blue jeans, ragged sweat suits, cut-off jeans, etc. Shirts without collars are acceptable.

Swim Complex: Appropriate swimming attire is required. Please remember that swim attire cannot be worn other places on the Club premises. It is important to have shirts and shoes to wear elsewhere on the Club premises.




GLOW-VIBE GOLF

Greens will undergo their 2nd aeration July 24 - 25. Please keep this in mind when scheduling your tee times.


THE ANNUAL INDEPENDENCE DAY FLAG TOURNAMENT.

GREENS REPORT



Although the year is already half over, our growing season is just getting started. After a very cool spring, we can finally grow grass! Nighttime temperatures in the low 70s and daytime temperatures in the 90s provide what the Bermuda needs for optimal growth.

July also brings aerification on the fairways, tees, and approaches, which takes place the week of July 17. Our 2nd greens aeration is July 24 & 25. These cultural practices represent a major part of our overall program for delivering the healthiest turf and best playing conditions possible.

We will start July by mowing the rough height at 1", and by the end of the month, the height will reach 1.25". So far this year, the rough has been healthy and growing vigorously. We will try to keep the height at a manageable and playable level.


CONGRATULATIONS, BRANDY!
